

Qualification Requirements for Personal Protection Outside the Home Instructor Candidates

Personal Protection Outside the Home Instructor Candidates must be both NRA Certified Basic Pistol Instructors as well as NRA Certified Personal Protection in the Home Instructors and must have passed the Personal Protection Outside the Home basic 14-hour course prior to attending the Basics of Personal Protection Outside the Home Instructor Training. They must then:

1. Pre-Test 90% or higher on the *Basic Personal Protection Outside the Home* Student Exam. It is **STRONGLY** recommended that Instructor Candidates (IC's) read the NRA handbooks *NRA Guide to the Basics of Personal Protection Outside the Home* (30000) *NRA Guide to the Basics of Personal Protection in the Home* (EF 14290), *The Basics of Pistol Shooting* (EF 13270) and *Home Firearm Safety* (ES 14120) prior to attending the Instructor Candidate class. 2. If it has been over a year since an instructor completed Basic Instructor Training, the Instructor Candidate must pass the current Trainer's Examination with 90% or higher when adding instructor ratings.
3. Unloading procedures: The candidate must demonstrate basic safe handling and unloading procedures for both a double-action revolver and a semi-automatic pistol.
