An additional charge of any amount over and above the stated range fee may be added to cover the costs related with sanctioned events and/or prizes and/or prize money. **Sanctioned event fees and monies for prizes are in addition to the WCW fees.**

Larger shooting events requiring exclusive use of the range will require a \$15.00 range fee plus 25 cents per target. The person in charge of the shoot must be responsible to record the number of shooters and targets used, collect the funds from each shooter, pay the appropriate WCW charges, pay any sanctioned fees to the appropriate parties and in addition he/she will distribute the prizes and make the prize money payouts from the remainder of the monies collected. These prizes and/or prize money payouts will be made in accordance with the payout description as advertised for the event. 2nd by Darian Carpenter. Passed;

New Business:

Gary Webster moved to close the nomination process for Board Members. 2nd by Darian Carpenter. Passed; Larry Mallory moved to pave the handicap parking areas. 2nd by Ken DeLeone. NRA 50 Shot Highpower Position Rifle Match

March 16, 2014 NRA 50 Shot High Power Match. This was the first match for the 2014 season and it started off very well in that we had 11 participants that almost gave us 2 full relays.

Special thanks to Fuzhou Hu who helped with the match administration and as always mister reliable, Orin Humphries who served as the match range officer.

This match was almost exclusively service rifles – representing over 70 years of US Military Service. The M1 Garand was used by 2 competitors, while a couple of M1As were present and the remainder were the more modern version, the AR15. Jeff McGee was the exception using his space gun match rifle on an AR platform. Jeff bears a High Master rating and the rest of the crew were mostly unclassified so guess who the match winner was? If you guessed Jeff, you'd be a winner as he was with a 494-20X

Top gun in Service Rifle was Robert Shuey firing an exceptionally hot 475-10X.

Fuzhou Hu was the high score for the Marksman/Unclassified group. Firing a 448-6X. There were conversations behind the firing line that he is a High Power Rock Star in the making.

Hope to see more folks at the next match. Please be sure to check the range bulletin for the dates. We did something a little different this year. Instead of the third Sunday of the month we went with the 4th Sunday in April and June as not to have a match scheduled for Easter and Father's Day. As a last note, please check with the range office to ensure the match is on. As we submitted the dates to the Board this year, we learned that Range 1 construction work may result in a match being canceled.



The 10th Annual Wally Siebert Shoot was contested on Saturday, March 8th at Kenmore. The match is shot at 100 and 200 yards. Each competitor fires 50 rounds for score and the top score with the most Xs takes home the trophy.

It's sad but Ted Larson, last year's winner, wasn't able to compete because he had to work. Work is always the curse of the serious shooter. But it was one less competitor for the others to have breathing down their necks. We had a terrific turnout. Fifteen shooters signed up hoping to walk off with a big trophy and a little money. The winds that were forecast didn't show up, so that was lucky. However, the rain that was forecast did make its appearance, for just about the whole match. Conditions were actually pretty good, though when the target sheets get soaked the bullet holes are difficult to see and the paper turns a sort of tan color. This was probably the wettest Siebert match we've ever had. But also one of the best.

It certainly was hotly contested and the winner wasn't decided until the last target sheet was scored. The challenge is to not drop any points, meaning shoot only "tens" and to score as many Xs as possible. If you drop a point you are probably out of luck. There was little wind so the scores were pretty high. In addition to the custom benchrest rifles (maximum weight 13.5 pounds) there were six shooters with factory or tactical rifles who decided to try their luck. It was great to have these shooters with us. Hopefully they'll, at some point, "graduate" into the custom class. It happens. Shooting high scores is addictive.

Well, here's how the shooting progressed through the day. After the 100 yard shooting seven shooters were clean in the score department but there was a difference in the X department. It became clear quickly that the winner was going to be the person who could shoot the most Xs. Here are the results for the

best seven shooters in the first half. All had scores of 250. (Twenty-five shots, maximum number value ten each bull). The X count is as follows: Jeff Yost 23X, Mustafa Bilal 22X, Jeff Lewis 22X, Rick Graham 19X, Bob Weesies 19X, Dennis Tyskiewicz 18X and Bob Boldman 14X. Clearly one has to build up a high X count at one hundred and not drop any points to have a chance to win. Even in good conditions it's hard to shoot a ton of Xs at 200 yards. And it's really easy to drop a point (or two). Which is what happened. Among the factory class shooters the top three scorers at 100 yards were Kevin Kellogg with 247-8X, Praveen Kumar with 238-3X and Martin Dahl with 237-5X. That is terrific shooting for non-benchrest guns.

As mentioned the wind wasn't a major problem at 200 yards, but visibility was tough and there were enough squirrely conditions to throw a bullet a fraction of an inch outside the 10 ring, which is enough to cause dismay (and a dropped point). As it turned out, two shooters were able to keep all their shots in the 10 ring throughout the match. And Jeff Yost came out on top, by one X. His score was 500-32X and Mustafa was right at his heels with a score of 500-31X. Congratulations to Jeff for his win and for setting a new range record! Jeff Lewis

was third, dropping one point and scoring 31X. Rick was fourth with a score of 499-25X. Dennis had a score of 498-24X, Bob Weesies had the same 498 but with one less X. Young Jack Sloan our fine competitor from Down Under (not Oregon, Australia!) scored 497-21X and Bob Boldman also scored 497 but with 18X. The polite young man from Australia is a fine shooter. He struggled a bit to find his groove at 100 yards but he was one of only three shooters who shot clean at 200. He's doing things the hard way and doing them well. Great shooting Jack and please make that long flight and shoot with us again next year. It's easy to imagine that some day that trophy is going to be sitting in a display case ten thousand miles away. In the factory class the top three shooters held the places they had at 100 yards. Kevin Kellogg won the big money among these shooters, dropping only six points all day (494-12X). The good-natured and intensely focused Praveen Kumar scored 476-5X. And Martin Dahl shot a score of 472-7X. He is also very good natured, like all our shooters of course, and brought a big jug of hot Starbucks. Thanks Martin!

Thanks to Bob Boldman for bringing his computer and printer. Thanks to Dennis for braving the rain to change all those targets and thanks to Jeff Yost for getting most of the matches going. How you were able to run the matches and shoot so amazingly well is beyond reckoning. It takes more than one person to run this match and it was great that so many were willing pitch in.

It was a terrific day if shooting. Thanks to all the shooters who came to shoot with us. It was good to see some new shooters. Phil Jordan, Jason and Brendan Mills, come back and shoot with us again, like next month. In April we start competing for our shooter-of-the-year trophy. It will be a score shoot also, but at 200 and 300 yards. Come sighted in at 300. The match will be April 12. Arrive a bit before 9:00 which is when we begin.
