President's Message

Last month of the year

It is very hard to believe that it's December already. It has been a great year for the club with the exception of the Department of Revenue coming up with new taxes. I don't know how much government we can afford. But I know I don't want as much as we have paid for. The ammo shortage continues, but thanks to rangemaster Chuck Barns, and his efforts, we have been able to find most calibers and even a little 22 rim fire.

Club growth

Over the past few years the club has had only a little growth each year. This year we had real growth. There have been so many new members at the orientation meetings that we have started providing two orientation meetings each month. By having two orientations each month new members do not have to wait as long to get their membership cards. Now new members can start using the ranges with less down time. As of last month our total membership exceeded 2,678 with 2008 voting members. One example of growth is in the number of trap lines the club has thrown this year. In years past the club has thrown a little over one million clay birds a year. If we keep up the pace for the rest of the year we anticipate throwing one million six hundred and fifty thousand targets. The employees and management at shotgun have done a great job and keep us safe. Thanks to all.

Rimfire Position Rifle

Smallbore League Shooting at WCW

The Puget Sound Rifleman's Association is a club-based 4-position rifle league. Teams from WCW, West Seattle, Cascade, and Paul Bunyan compete in this league. The WCW fields 2 teams. Teams from the WCW came in first place in 2012 and 2013.

Home matches are fired in the Clubhouse. Shooters fire 40 shots for record each match (10 prone, 10 sitting, 10 kneeling, and 10 standing) using .22 caliber rifles with either metallic sights or a riflescope.

The league will run 11 or 12 weeks beginning January 7. Most matches are fired at WCW but usually one match will be fired at West Seattle and one at Cascade. A very enjoyable awards banquet is held in April after the league session is completed.

Equipment required is a smallbore target rifle, spotting scope, shooting jacket, sling, shooting glove and kneeling roll. If you don't have all of the equipment, we will try to find some for you to borrow.

The WCW will host practice sessions prior to the 2014 league on Tuesdays from November 12 to December 24 between 7:00 and 9:00 PM.

These practice sessions offer a great chance for WCW members to try out smallbore position shooting.

The match on Saturday November 9 had a few surprises. The first was the weather. Unlike last Saturday that had high winds which left the area littered with downed branches and power outages, this Saturday had very light winds and no rain during the match. The wind, while variable in its direction never exceeded 2 MPH. This made for some wonderful conditions and excellent scores.

A total of 12 shooters attended, with 3 shooters joining with us for the first time. First we had Kristin Johns, the daughter of Kenmore veteran Bob Boldman join us. While this was her first Kenmore match, she has been gaining some trigger time shooting at Tacoma Rifle and Revolver club with Bob. Second we had Manuel Gonzalez who has been doing some shooting at Eatonville's 600 yard range. And our last visitor David Kahley came all the way from Pennsylvania as a guest of Jeff Yost. David took time out from his busy schedule of touring the wineries of Woodinville to shoot his first ever benchrest match. He also gets this month's award for traveling the furthest distance to shoot with us.

This month we ran the match a little different than we have in the past. First, a decision was made to shoot all 4 matches at 300 yards. Second, to save time, while using the usual 5 bull plus sighter score target, we shot 4-10 shot matches, one match on each of the 4 upper bulls, but still scored them as a score target. Targets were not changed till the end of the match, so only the final score is reported. Due to the 10 shots on each bull, the scoring at the end proved to be a little challenging.

Now, onto the results of the match. In fifth place we had Dennis Tyskiewicz with a score of 393-2X. Coming in at fourth place was John Parrish with an identical score of 393, but with 6 X's.

Third place was rewarded with a cash prize of \$5 and was earned by our 2013 champion Ted Larson with a very good score of 398-5X. Second place was won by our match director for the past 10 years, Rick Graham by shooting a score of 398 with 9X's. Good shooting Rick, and for his efforts he was awarded a whole \$10. And the big winner surprised me, but proved how important equipment is. David Kahley in his first ever benchrest match shooting Jeff Yost's rifle, won with a score of 399-11X. For that excellent score, David took home \$15 dollars. Later on that evening, David wanted to know when the next match was and thought he would fly out for it. Something tells me he is better at shooting than math.

Next month's match is on Saturday December 14. This is typically a hunting rifle match. In this match, no front rests are allowed, only sand bags or bipods. Rear bags are allowed. All matches are shot at 100 yards. If you only have a varmint rifle, bring it and we will have a second class.

Holiday Rush

It's the time of year when Range Committee meetings get very busy with members requesting Special Use privileges. To help expedite processing of all the requests, it is important for the members to remember that no Special Use request will be processed unless 2014 dues have been paid and a new blue membership card can be presented at the Range Committee meeting when requesting Special Use privileges. When attending Range Committee meetings for Special Use requests, you must have your 2014 membership card or we can't process your request.

If you have previously had Special Use privileges and your new 2014 card is received without them, then you will need to attend a Range Committee meeting to request them again. Per Club policy, you will have to re-request Special Use if you are a newer member and have not had approved Special Use privileges for three consecutive years; or this is your 10th year for Special Use.

If either of these is the case, then your 2014 membership card will not have any Special Use privileges noted on it. Remember, if your 2014 membership card doesn't have Special Use privileges on it, and you wish to use Club range facilities not available to the general public, then you will need to attend a Range Committee meeting to request Special Use privileges.

Because of the high demand for Special Use privileges this time of year, the January and February Range Committee meetings will be moved from the Chalet to the Clubhouse. Depending on demand, we may move the December and March meetings to the Clubhouse as well. Please check the Activity Calendar to be sure. This should make things much more comfortable when sitting through our dynamic Special Use Presentation.

One last thought, please take a moment

Become an NRA Instructor

You CAN become an NRA Certified Instructor! All it takes is a three day weekend and a desire to pass along your skills to a new shooter. We will be teaching an NRA Basic Instructor class for Rifle, Pistol, and Shotgun on January 24, 25, and 26, 2014. (choose your discipline - sorry, you can only earn one of these certifications per Instructor Training weekend).

The process is simple. Go to the Instructor Training web page on the our web site (http://www.wcwinc.org/club/educ4.htm) for the details. Or call Richard Ripley at 206-271-0670 or Phil Murray at 425-844-1918 to discuss it.

As a WCW member, there is no cost to you (and this is a \$175 value!). We do ask that you teach a class occasionally both to pay it back, and to hone your teaching skills. But you'd want to do that anyway, right?

Please consider this – the Wildlife Committee of Washington has one of the most active instructional programs in the northwest. We train in excess of 400 people every year, so there is lots of opportunity to practice.

Bits and Pieces

It's time again to get your member dues into the club. Dues have been increased to handle the sales taxes newly imposed by Washington State on the dues of non-profit organizations. Dues are now \$150 single and \$200 family. When renewing, be sure to use the 2014 Renewal form.

Additionally, please include all the information required on the form and make sure it is legible. The guy who enters all this information into the computer will certainly appreciate it.

Remember your 2013 card is only valid until January 1, with a grace period until the end of February. If everyone waits until the last minute, it may take a significant amount of time to get it processed.
