## NRA Training Opportunities

In June we are offering some special opportunities for NRA Training. Which of these sounds interesting to YOU???

### NRA MUZZLELOADING RIFLE COURSE

**29-30 June 2013**

**Short Description :** Teaches the basic knowledge, skills, and attitude essential to the safe and efficient use of a muzzle-loading rifle. And it opens up a longer hunting season (Primitive weapons season!)

**More Details:** The course is 14 hours in length and includes classroom instruction and time on a range shooting a muzzleloading rifle. Students learn the NRA's three rules for safe gun handling; parts; loading; shooting; cleaning; shooting from a standing position and shooting from a crossed stick position; and continued opportunities for skill development. Kenmore Range supplies all necessary equipment - firearms, accessories, ammunition components, eye and hearing protection, etc.. Upon successful completion students will receive the NRA Muzzleloading Rifle Course Completion Certificate.

Class is limited to 6 students. Fee: \$75.00 Please sign up with the Range-master.

### NRA RANGE SAFETY OFFICER (RSO) CERTIFICATION COURSE

**29 June 2013**

Do you participate in competitive shooting events? Are you interested in ensuring range safety? Would you like to become involved in the administration of competition events? Do you want to become in the Boy Scouts of America firearms education and shooting sports?

*This is the class for you!*

**Short Description:** Develops NRA Certified Range Safety Officers with the knowledge, skills, and attitude essential

to organizing, conducting, and supervising safe shooting activities and range operations.

**More Details:** This course is eleven hours long and is conducted in a classroom and at a shooting facility (but this is a non-shooting class). Range Safety Officer candidates will learn roles and responsibilities of an RSO; Range Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs); range inspection; range rules; range briefings; emergency procedures; and firearm stoppages and malfunctions. Successful completion of the course results in certification as an NRA Certified Range Safety Officer.

Class is limited to 15 students. Fee: \$140, which includes all NRA processing and certification fees. WCW members who are interested in assisting with administration of competitive shooting events at the club may qualify for a **FREE** scholarship to this course in exchange for officiating in 2-3 events a year. Scholarships are limited and are subject to approval and endorsement by current match or event directors.

Individuals seeking certification in order to work with the Boy Scouts of America and who present a letter of endorsement from their District may be eligible for an NRA/BSA discount on educational materials.

## Training Aids Needed For Firearm Education Classes

The Firearms Education program at Kenmore Range is seeking donations of training aids for use in our classes. ## ***CMP/Highpower Rifle***

### **May 19, 2013 NRA 50 Shot High Power Match**

Fourteen riflemen turned out for the Sunday High Power Match. Sadly we had to miss the member swap meet. Given the inability to use the west bay, we had to have 3 relays, with just 4 spaces remaining to have a full house on the 3<sup>rd</sup> relay.

Orin Humphries filled the roll as the range Officer in Charge. A good thing as Orin is a recognized M1 Garand Guru and we had a couple in action that day.

For this match we had 2 rifle types, Match Rifle and Service Rifle. The match winner was Jeff McGee firing a near perfect 494 – 21X. First runner up in the match rifle category was Mark Moran with a 480 -8X. Second runner up in the MR category, John Donahue with 396 – 4X.

For Service Rifles we grouped all the

classified shooters together, 1 Expert, 1 Sharp Shooter and 2 Marksmen. Robert Shuey was the top service rifle firing 464 – 7X followed by John Slater using his venerable M1A firing a 434 – 6X. In the unclassified group, Mark McCallister was number 1 shooting 412 – 4X.

Orin and I got caught not having a CMP rule book on us as questions were asked about a couple of rifles that we classified as Match Rifles as we judged they didn't meet Service Rifle categorization. The question at hand of course is "What constitutes a Service Rifle?" I refer to the 17<sup>th</sup> Edition of the CMP Rule Book, published on March 1, 2013, as the Revised NRA Rule Book, published January 2013, section 3.1(e) "Any rifle or modified rifle not covered by NRA Rule 3.1, but permitted by CMP Rules is considered a service rifle in NRA sanctioned competition." In the 2013 CMP Rule Book, Section 6.2.3 U.S. Rifle, Caliber 5.56mm, M16 describes the configuration in detail. As not to digress at length on M16 variants as the rules have plenty, I will summarize to write that M4 variants are permitted when they are equipped with a fixed-length stock and the rifle has a carry handle and rear sight that has the same configuration as the carry handle on the M16 A2.

In retrospect for future matches, perhaps our members and guests would be better served if we have 3 categories, Match Rifle, Service Rifle and Any.

## Kenmore Ten4Ten Traditional Rifle Match

**DATE:** July 7, 2013 (Sunday)

**PLACE:** Kenmore Range  
1031-228th S.W., Bothell, Wa 98021

**TIME:** 1:00 PM start

**PHONE:** (425) 481-8686

**EVENTS:** One target per entry, 10 shots at 100 yards match

<b>COURSE OF FIRE:</b>	Match 1	22 Rim Fire	10 rounds at 100 yards
	Match 2	Center fire Match	10 rounds at 100 yards

**RULES:** A center fire rifle can be of any caliber, not equipped with palm rest or Schuetzen type buttplate, weighing not over 9.5 pounds including detachable magazine and sights. A .22 rim fire rifle not equipped with palm rest or Schuetzen type buttplate, weighing not over 8.5 pounds including magazine and sights.

Targets used will be B-17 (standard WCW target). If your rifle is over the minimum weight, you may participate using an MR31 target set at the same distance; ie. 100 yards.

All shots will be taken from the benches. No bipods or sandbags will be used; just you and your rifle. The benches have carpet coverings.

No sighters will be fired. The match theory is that you shoot the rifle you have, much as the Minutemen did during our 'little difficulty' with England in 1775.

*No match rifles in any classification will be allowed.*

**ELIGIBILITY:** All competitors welcome.

**CLASSIFICATION:** Open, Juniors(12-17 yrs old), Seniors(62-69 yrs old), Grand Masters(70 yrs old and above). NRA classification system will not be used – it is to be a fun match, relaxed but SAFE.

**SQUADDING:** All matches shall be squadded. Each will accommodate 10 competitors.

**SCORING:** Scoring shall be done by competitors. Score plug use by Match Officials only.

**CHALLENGES** shall be made to Match Official immediately after relay is ended. **Challenge fee \$ 1.00 ea. Hole.**

**AWARDS:** First place in each category.

**ENTRY FEE:** \$10.00 per target

**ENTRIES:** Advance entries receive priority. Purchase numbered ticket at range office or trap office during public hours.

**DIRECTIONS TO RANGE:** Coming either north or south on I-5, get off on the 182 Bellevue off ramp. Stay on I-405 South until exit 26 (first exit). Exit at 26 and stay in right lane, merging right. Turn right at light (228th S.W.) and proceed about 1.5 miles to the range on the right.
