WCW Youth Programs

WCW youth programs in Rifle, Shotgun and Archery provide excellent instruction on the basics principles of a safe and skilled shooting experience for young people irrespective of age , gender and ability. Our youth Rifle shooters are provided use of small bore rifle's sized to fit the young shooter. Every Friday evening from September until April shooters are taught by NRA Certified coaches, with over thirty years of combined experience. Stop in and see a Saturday match. You will observe young, safe, and skilled shooters of all ages enjoying themselves.

Our youth Shotgun program like our Rifle program provides our young shooters shotgun's sized to fit. Coaches Gary and Pat Webster, David Levinson, Daniel Oliver, Nathan Ware and Joe Rinaldi provide instruction on the safe handling and skill required to break clay targets on both trap and five stand stations. In November the young shooter begins there journey by breaking their first target and by the end of their instruction in March breaking twenty of twenty five targets is not an impossible task. Since 2001 when the program started many

shooters have learned how to safely handle a shotgun and some have returned to help promote a successful program. Can you say coach Nathan Ware.

Thanks to Mike Wichser and his assistant coaches the Junior Olympic Archery Development program (JOAD) our Youth Archery Program has become one of the top in the Nation with multiple National Champions and many making the US National Teams. Last year alone we placed four out of ten girls who make up the Junior (age 18 to 20) and Cadet (age 15 to 17) National Teams. They are for the Junior Madison Eich, Elizabeth Caughell and Alexis Drake, for the Cadet Eliana Claps. That is almost half of the National team from our club. Pretty Cool.

We also placed two girls on the World teams. The first being Eliana Claps who last October travelled to China and represented the US and our club in the Outdoor World Championship's. Next is Elizabeth Caughell who recently made the US World Team and will be traveling to France the end of February where she will be representing the US and our club in the Indoor World Championships.

It appears to me that our Youth programs are next to none thanks to all the volunteers who make them that way.

Discussions were held concerning a restricted membership for those 18 to 21 years of age, the tree encroachment thru the fence by a neighbor by our North property line. (Darian will send a response to the property owner), have the new membership cards available at each

orientation meeting, use of White Flyer birds for competition leagues at Shotgun, Human Resource training for employees & Board members and Range closures on Holidays. The Board is attempting to standardize shooting fees for rifle and pistol events and the following is the proposal that will be voted on at the next Board Meeting.

A fee of \$15.00 for each participant including range use, taxes and targets for a 1/2 day event. An additional charge of any amount over and above the stated range fee may be added to cover the costs related with sanctioned events and/or prizes and/or prize money. **Sanctioned event fees and monies for prizes are in addition to the WCW fees.** Larger shooting events requiring all day use of the range will require a \$15.00 range fee plus 25 cents per target. The person in charge of the shoot must be responsible to record the number of shooters and targets used. Collect the funds from each shooter. Pay the appropriate WCW charges. Pay any sanctioned fees to the appropriate parties, and in addition he/she will distribute the prizes and make the prize money payouts from the remainder of the monies collected. These prizes and/or prize money payouts will be made in accordance with the payout description as advertised for the event. This is necessary due to the current Washington State Tax Structure. WCW cannot hold the money without the possibility of severe tax implications.

Ken DeLeone moved to adjourn this meeting. Meeting adjourned at 10.25 PM. Submitted by Dan Barton, Recording Secretary.

Washington State Politics

Recently the Washington Legislature convened for 2014. This year our most significant issue will be initiative 594. This initiative is a gun control bill being falsely promoted as a "Universal background check" measure. In reality I-594 is a universal handgun registration scheme. Under I-594 every time a handgun is transferred the person receiving the handgun will need to be registered with the state department of licensing. I-594 specifically regulates transfers and not sales. A person handing his or her handgun to a family member or friend cannot do so without going through a background check and State Registration with a gun dealer.

This initiative along with all the bills introduced last year are still pending for possible consideration during the 2014 session. These are: House Bill 1839, House Bill 1588, House Bill 1676, House Bill 1703, and House Bill 1840, in the Senate they are: Senate Bill 5711, Senate Bill 5737, and Senate Bill 5739.

The above information has been reproduced from information sent in alerts from NRA ILA. Alerts regarding gun control issues are just, another reason, why all our members should consider joining the NRA. You should also know that all the gun control bills in both the House and Senate were sponsored by Washington State Democrats. I know, I was shocked too.

**Kenmore Range
Benchrest
Matches**

Saturday, February 8, brought sunshine, cold temperatures and 11 shooters to Kenmore. All matches were 10 shots on 5 bulls at 200 yards. This was the first shoot that I can remember in while where we had enough shooters (4) with factory rifles to have their own class. Two new shooters also joined us. Michael Gonzales, shooting his father Manwell's 6 BR set up for long range shot his first match. Sam Bollinger also joined us in the factory class.

From an observer's point of view, the conditions looked good, but that can be deceiving. For match 1 in custom class, Rick Graham made it look easy with 100-6x, followed by Dennis Tyskiewicz with 100-1x and Doug Schwind with 100-0x. In factory class, Kevin Kellogg lead the pack with 90-0x, Praveen Kumar was second with 93-2x and third place was occupied by Martin Dahl at 92-0x.

Match 2 had Rick again leading the way with 100-4x and Dennis right behind at 100-3x. Richard Nicol placed third with a score of 99-2x. Good shooting. The factory class shooters demonstrated that you don't need a custom rifle to clean the target at 200 yards. Once again, Kevin placed first with an excellent 100-3x, followed closely with a 100-2x by Martin Dahl. Third place went to Praveen's 93-1x.

Match three had some serious competition. Dennis T demonstrated that he is always a contender and shot a 100-4x to edge out Rick Graham with a 100-3x. Meanwhile at the other end of the range Richard Nicol had a nice 100-2x. Factory class had a tie for first. A 96-1x was shot by both Kevin and Praveen. Martin Dahl occupied third place with a 93-1x. From the number of clean targets shot, it looks like conditions had gotten a little unfriendly in match 4. Despite the conditions, Rick demonstrated it was possible to still shoot clean with 100-3x. Second place with a 98-2x held by

Dennis T and third with a 98-1x by Doug Schwind. Factory class was won with a 98-3x by Kevin, a 96-1x shot by Martin was second and Praveen shot a 94-0x for third.

Final scores were tallied and prizes awarded for both custom and factory class. Starting with factory class, Praveen Kumar was our third place finisher with a final score of 376-4x. Second place went to a 381-4x shot by Martin Dahl. In first place with a nice 390-7X was Kevin Kellogg. The custom class third place finisher was Doug Schwind with a 391-5x. Shooting a 398-8x was Dennis Tyakiewicz for second place. And in first place, shooting a clean score of 400-16x was Rick Graham. Excellent shooting by everyone. From the scores shot by some of the factory rifles, they are becoming competitive with the custom rifles.

Remember, our next shoot is the Siebert shoot named after Wally Siebert, a local shooter who made benchrest optics what they are today. The match will be held on Saturday March 8 at 9AM. This match follows closely the IBS Varmint For Score (VFS) format. Five-five shot score targets are shot at 100 yards. This will take most of the morning. We will have a lunch break and then finish the match with 5-5 shot targets at 200 yards. Don't expect to finish much before 5 PM. This is the one match where we hold rifles to Heavy Varmint class, no more than 13.5 pounds. If there are 3 or more, we will also have a factory class. We also draw bench numbers, so see the range master before you set up. Hope to see everyone there.
