Treasurer's Report:

John Woolley presented.
April was a bad month because of the
pandemic. March was a better month
because of the property rental.

Trustees Report:

Larry Mallory presented.
Larry and Dale visited some local ranges to
check if they were open and how they were
operating. Several local ranges are currently
open and operating under different levels of
guidelines.

Old Business:

No old business was discussed.



New Business:

Facility Rentals

Larry spoke with the facility renters yesterday
about their cadence. The renters will
continue the current cadence until mid-July.
We may lose them after July depending on
their needs.

Opening the Range

Robert presented potential issues with
opening the range. Robert does not believe
we would be able to open before June 12th.
One reason for this is that some key
employees are not available until then. Also,
employee training must be completed ahead
of the opening, some range cleanup is
needed, and we need to mark different areas
with tape for social distancing. The office has
already been modified to meet recommended
safety criteria. There are masks and gloves for
the employees. We are also prepared with
sufficient hand sanitizer and wipes. We have
an established Standard Operating Procedure
(SOP) identified for regimental cleaning after
every shift and evening. Robert also provided
SOPs for employees and members.
We discussed what we would need to do if we
opened. We will need to have an employee at
the front gate. We would open to members
only. Members would have to show their
credentials and provide their name and
member ID at the gate. If the range is full, we
will have to establish an approach to have
them wait or contact them when a space is
available. Special Use will still be allowed. If
we opened the range, we would only be open
to members Friday, Saturday, Sunday, and
Monday from noon to 7pm. Special Use
would follow the normal early hours on
Friday, Saturday, Sunday and Monday. The
range will be closed Tuesday through
Thursday, including Special Use.
We will not open up to the public before

Phase 3.

Andrew G. and Dave E. suggested we contact
the unemployment office and find out more
information about the workshare to make
sure our employees benefit from the current
government relief.

Larry believes we should re-open to members
using the well thought out plan that Robert
put together.

Joe asked Ping if it is best to email members
or put it out on the website. Ping thought if
we open to members only, we should send
out an email and post the information on the
website. Dave L. said the member SOP needs
to be included in the email. We will not
accommodate new members except for those
who have already paid.

Robb suggested putting out a sign that we will
be opening soon. Robert said he will put a
note on the social media page for the
neighborhood when we will open.

Joe moved that we open the club to only
members on June 12th using the protocols for
employees and members outlined by Robert
Haverstock's documents. Jim Thompson
seconded. Motion passed.

Lastly, we briefly talked about opening daily at
9am when we get to phase 2. We will discuss
this further on a later date.

Dale Sieg moved to adjourn at 8:30 PM. Larry
Mallory seconded. Passed.
